PACE CAR PLEDGE

- When driving I will**
1. Obey the posted speed limit.
 2. Stop to let pedestrians cross and be courteous to cyclists and other road users.
 3. Minimize car use by using active transportation, carpooling and transit whenever possible.
 4. Avoid distractions by paying close attention to the road.
 5. Display the Pace Car decals on my vehicle and encourage others to take the Pace Car pledge.

By agreeing to drive the posted speed limit, cars become a “mobile speed bump,” slowing speeding traffic behind them. Drivers also agree to be more aware of and courteous to other road users, especially pedestrians and cyclists. Many Pace Cars can effectively calm traffic throughout your neighbourhood. The more people who join, the better it works!
